When and Where to Vote:

- Election Day is Tuesday, November 6, 2012.
- Polls are open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Find your local polling station at <https://voter.azsos.gov>.
- Here are some other ways to find your polling place:

- If you do not have a photo ID with a current address, bring two IDs that contain your name and address such as a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, tribal enrollment card, etc.
- You cannot be turned away from voting because you did not bring proper identification. If you do not have proper ID, you can use a provisional ballot.

Absentee Voting:

- Absentee voting is available to all members of the U.S. Military and overseas voters.
- Request an absentee voting ballot from <http://www.azsos.gov/election/military.htm>, and mail it to your local election authority.
- Absentee ballots can be requested until 5:00 p.m. on October 26, 2012.
- Ballots must be mailed in or delivered in person and received by 7:00 p.m. on November 6, 2012.
- People are strongly encouraged to go to the polls to vote if possible.

How to Register to Vote:

- Register to vote online at <https://servicearizona.com/webapp/evoter/selectLanguage>.
- Or, print the voter registration form from <http://www.azsos.gov/election/VoterRegistration.htm>, and mail it to your local election authority.
- Re-register to vote if you have moved, changed your name, or would like to declare an official party affiliation. If your voter registration information has not changed, you do not need to re-register.
- Registration must be received by October 9, 2012.

Early Voting:

- All registered voters are eligible for early voting in person or by mail.
- Early voting begins on October 11 until November 6, 2012. Call your local elections official for specific dates, locations, and hours that polling places will be open.

What to Bring on Election Day:

- Bring a photo ID with your current address, such as an Arizona driver's license or a state ID.

Your Rights as an Arizona Voter are as Follows:

- To vote if you have registered by October 9, 2012.
- To have questions concerning voting procedures answered and to receive assistance if needed.

- To vote without being intimidated, threatened, or coerced.
- To vote if you are eligible to do so even if you do not bring an ID to the polls.
- To vote using a provisional ballot if your registration comes into question.
- If you feel that your rights are violated or you witness a violation of rights in the registration or voting process, please contact the Arizona Election Services at (602) 542-8683.
- Your vote is private- The ballots are processed in such a way that your identity will not be distinguishable from your ballot.
